What is the Fulbright?

- The U.S. Student Fulbright Program provides one-year grants for graduate study, research, or teaching assistantships abroad. Each year, over 1,900 grants are awarded for study in over 155 foreign countries.
- The goal of the Fulbright program is to give students opportunities for research and study abroad while promoting mutual understanding amongst nations.
- Students apply TO a specific country FOR a specific program or research project

What is an English Teaching Assistantship (ETA)?

- Fulbright ETAs allow students to teach English in a variety of foreign countries.
 The programs vary by country, with students teaching elementary school children, high school, or college-level English.
- Most ETA positions are 20 hours/week. In your remaining time, the Fulbright expects students to become involved in the community through service, research, or other experiences.
- Some countries require applicants be fluent in the host language; some require no prior language knowledge at all.
- Below is a list of countries offering ETAs in 2016-2017, designated by language requirements:

What is a Full Grant?

 Fulbright Full Grants are awarded to conduct year-long research projects or study in foreign countries. Students must have designed and planned their own projects, and must coordinate an affiliation with a foreign institution (university, non-profit, etc.)

Who is eligible to apply?

- Applicants must be U.S. citizens.
- Competitive students will have a 3.3+ GPA, higher for research grants
- Graduating Seniors may apply in the fall of their Senior year. Students must have a bachelor's degree by the time they begin their Fulbright program. Seniors will apply through the Undergraduate Fellowship Office.
- Recent graduates who are not enrolled in graduate school may also apply through the UFO. OSU alumni who are enrolled in graduate programs should apply through their graduate institution.
- Language requirements vary by country, with many requiring prior knowledge of the native language.
- Students applying for a Full Grant must have a thoroughly developed research proposal.
- Competitive applicants will have previous research experience (full grants), relevant extra-curricular activities, leadership & service experience, and other honors & awards.

How do I apply?

- Recent graduates and graduating seniors will both apply through the Undergraduate Fellowship Office. Grad/Professional students will apply through the graduate school. Students should register with the UFO by June 29, 2015.
- Students apply to a specific country for a specific program/project proposal. The first step is to select the country you wish to apply to and the program or research project you wish to complete there.
- Students submit applications online. The application consists of a personal statement, proposal of study, application form, transcript, language evaluation, and three letters of recommendation.
- Applications are due by 9am on Tuesday, September 1, 2015.
- The UFO provides Fellowship Advising to help undergraduates through the process and assist you in writing your application essays, obtaining letters of recommendation, and establishing affiliations abroad.
